On September 5, President Trump ordered an end to the Obama-era program Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA), urging Congress to pass a replacement before its protections are phased out in 6 months. DACA allows an estimated 800,000 young adults, who were brought to the United States illegally as children, to remain here without fear of immediate removal and gives them the right to work legally.

This information session is an opportunity to discuss the legal implications of the repeal of DACA, learn how DACA beneficiaries can continue to maintain their status under the program, and learn how community organizations can get involved to engage their lawmakers.
